HISTORY OF THE UNION

The Bacon Factories Union of Employees (B.F.U.E.) was formally registered in August 1946, its members having broken away from the Australasian Meat Industry Employees' Union (A.M.I.E.U.) during a long and bitter strike earlier in that year. The Union was, and has remained, relatively small. Initially the union covered 487 of Queensland's 549 bacon factory workers, all of whom were to be found in the state's south-east corner. Today the union has approximately 900 members. They are employed in a number of meatworks or bacon factories, manufacturing meat products under such household names as KR Castlemaine, Hans, Huttons, John Dee and Hans Fresh, in addition many supermarket generic brands..

Even before the B.F.U.E. was established in August 1946, it was clear that bacon factory workers had different industrial interests from those working in the large beef processing works. While bacon factories normally operated for twelve months of the year, work in the beef sector was strictly seasonal, as the summer heat stopped the movement of cattle for up to four months. Thus, where the meat worker was typically a seasonal worker, bacon factory workers enjoyed a more stable and permanent relationship with their employer. The fact that most bacon factories were either owned by local families or co-operatives also added to the closer ties between workers and management in these factories.

From its formation the B.F.U.E. faced the challenge of preserving the separate interests of its members, while campaigning effectively on their behalf. During its first 25 years it struggled to achieve this. Union resources were few, while employers often did not take the union seriously. This began to change in the early 1970's. A younger breed of activists began to involve themselves in the union. These activists brought with them a more forceful and professional approach. In consequence by the 1980's the union had reached a new maturity, possessing the ability to represent its members in an effective fashion. Despite its small size, the B.F.U.E. is well respected within the wider trade union movement.

The history of the B.F.U.E. demonstrates that there is still a place for smaller unions. Whereas the ties between the membership and officials have often been lost in large "super-unions", the B.F.U.E. is still able to offer its members a personalised service and many of the "extra benefits" the larger Unions provide.

The Union is affiliated to the Queensland Council of Unions (Q.C.U.) which provides representation on behalf of all Unionists in Queensland.
